

Paper Mache bowls



You will need:

- Newspaper
- Water
- Paint
- Flour
- Bowl

Steps:

1. Mix water and flour together in a bowl.
2. Add food colouring to the mix.
3. Stir until the mix is runny like white glue.
4. Put the mix into the fridge.
5. Rip the newspaper into short strips.
6. Turn the bowl upside down and dip the newspaper strips into the glue
7. Cover the bowl with the wet newspaper, making sure that each strip is overlapping each other.
8. Let the newspaper dry out, before separating the newspaper from the bowl.

Rainbow house



You will need:


- Cardboard
- Coloured paper
- Glue
- Sticky tape
- Scissors

Steps:


1. Use your scissors to cut out and glue cardboard together to make a house.
2. Cut out different coloured circles from the coloured paper.
3. Start from the bottom of the house and place glue on half of the circled paper.
4. Stick the circles onto the cardboard house.
5. Continue to stick different coloured circles onto the house until all of the cardboard is covered.
6. Wait for the glue to dry.

Box Loom Weaving

- Cardboard box without a top. We cut ours to be about 5 cm's tall.
- Something sharp to poke holes in the box, such as a seam ripper or fat needle.
- Ruler
- Wool or string of different colours.
- Scissors
- Fat needle. You could tape your yarn to the end of a popsicle stick.
- 2 popsicle sticks (or chopstick, heavy piece of paper, cardboard, ruler, etc.)



1. Start with a box.
2. Poke about 10 holes across two edges of the box. The holes should be roughly 1.5 cm's apart.
3. Tie a knot at one end of a long piece of and run the wool through the holes, from one side of the box to the other.
4. When you reach the other side, make sure that the wool is tight and tie another knot so that the wool stays put.



1. Run a new piece of wool through your needle and tie one end of the wool to either the left or right bottom side of the wool. Push the wool through to lines of wool, making sure to go up and over each line of wool.
2. After weaving the wool back and forth a few times, weave a popsicle stick below the string. This will keep the wool straight.
3. Keep weaving!



1. Place another popsicle stick at the other end of the weaving to straighten it out.
2. To add another colour, simply tie the wool you're done with to another colour, or tie it to the edge string and then tie a new colour to the wool. Trim your string.
3. Keep on weaving and adding more colours.



1. When the weaving is done, make a knot at the end of the wool.
2. Cut the ends of the weaving away from the box loom
3. Tie two pieces of wool together to make a knot. If you have five dangling wool strings at each end, you should tie a total of five knots.
4. Your weaving is done!

Making Rainbow Pom Poms



1. Draw 2 circles into cardboard and cut a hole in the middle to make a donut.
2. Thread wool through the circles until all the wool is used up.
3. Cut the wool all around.
4. Tie a string between the 2 cardboard circles. Take off the cardboard circles.
5. Trim the pom pom.

Stained Glass Craft



1. Cut out black card in a shape that you like.
2. Put the black paper shape onto the contact paper.
3. Lay out the strips of tissue paper onto the contact paper, when finished put another piece of contact paper on the top of the tissue paper.
4. Trim and hang up in a window.

Marbled paper



You will need:

- Shaving cream (inexpensive works well)
- Food colouring
- Paper
- Baking tray
- Chopstick or pencil
- Whisk
- Mixing bowl or ice-cream container

Steps:

1. Mix about 1 cup a shaving cream with a small amount of water.
2. Pour mixture into tray.
3. Drop small amounts of food colouring onto the mixture. Use chopstick or pencil or swirl colour together.
4. Lay paper on top of shaving cream and gently press to allow design to print onto paper.
5. Lift paper out and hang to dry. Scrap off excess shaving cream if desired.
