Who can access the GP?

- Only students enrolled at Goodna Special School can access the GP clinic.

How much does it cost?

- It's free! The GP will bulk-bill through Medicare - so please remember to bring your child's card or number along!

What if my child already has a GP?

- If you would like your child to see the school GP, their medical records can be transferred. Consent for this must be provided by their parent/carer.

Can I come to the appointment with my child?

- Yes! This is encouraged and especially recommended for students who are younger than 12. For older students, we can provide a support person to attend the appointment if you choose and the GP can link parents in by telehealth.

Can the GP refer my child to other health services if needed?

- Yes!

What if I don't want my child to see a GP?

- All students require parent/carer consent to see the GP.

What if my child is not eligible for a Medicare card?

- We want all of our students to access healthcare they need. Please contact the school to discuss arrangements for your child to see the GP free of charge.
